QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS
(By Dr. T. C. W.)

QUESTION: "Can anything be done to heal a rupture in the right side of a child of two?" Is there any cure besides an operation? How much should the operation cost?"
Answer: Sometimes it is possible to overcome a rupture in a child by the use of a suitably fitted truss having the child wear it constantly during the daytime. A lighter truss may be used for nighttime. In some cases this method will produce a cure, although it may take from one to two years. Meanwhile, keep the child on a careful diet, having him omit foods which may be gas-forming such as onions, baked beans, cooked beans, cooked cabbage, garlic, apricot, etc. The only other alternative is an operation. I do not know the fee for this service in your locality. Of course the charge would probably be much lower if you have a doctor in general practice take the case. If you go to a specialist the fee might be higher.

QUESTION: "What do you suppose is the cause of a boy continually picking at his nose?"
Answer: Your boy may be troubled with chronic catarrh or enlargement of the adenoid tissue. In such cases, nose picking is simply the result of habit.

SEES FUND USED TO FINANCE WAR
Senator Taft Will Seek To Curb Secret Operations Of Stabilization Account.

Washington, March 5—(AP)—Senator Taft (R., Ohio) protested today that the Treasury's \$2,000,000,000 stabilization fund could be used to finance an European war and said he would seek to curb its secret operations.

Taft announced he would ask first that the fund be reduced to one-third its present size, explaining: "Secretary Morgenthau testified that the Treasury never has used more than \$200,000,000 of the fund."

He referred to Morgenthau's account yesterday, to a Senate Banking

RADIO Day by Day
Eastern Standard Time

New York, March 5—(AP)—After nearly two decades of existence, radio yesterday participated in another milestone first. It was the broadcast in connection with the election of Eugenio Cardinal Pacelli as Pope Pius XII.

On Feb. 6, 1932, when Pius XI was named, broadcasting was only in its beginnings on an individual station basis and the first radio chain hookup was not looked upon as a possibility. Transatlantic broadcast transmission also was out of the question, the first overseas pickup not coming until 1934.

The broadcast from the Vatican via all networks included description of the smoke signal that the pope had been selected as well as the later announcement from the balcony of St. Peter's. There were supplementary broadcasts before and after the election, one of them being the pope's address to the world.

Plans now are underfoot to relay to this country a description of the coronation.

Nothing definite has been decided, but there is a possibility that the Ames and Andy program will be shifted by the sponsor from NBC, where it has been appearing since 1932, to CBS.

THINK ROOSEVELT MAY TOUCH WORLD AFFAIRS

Charleston, S. C., March 5—(AP) President Roosevelt was sailing up the South Atlantic coast for his first port today after a two-week absence that gave him an opportunity to see the first hand how the United States would go about defending it.

The fact that the fleet maneuvers were postponed in his mind and that Congress is now setting on its course for the anniversary of the debating foreign policies in general gave rise to speculation among some members of his party here that they touch upon world affairs in his speech to the 100th anniversary session of Congress tomorrow.

The chief executive was due here on the cruise Houston late this afternoon. He will remain for Washington between 7 and 9 p. m. arriving tomorrow morning.
