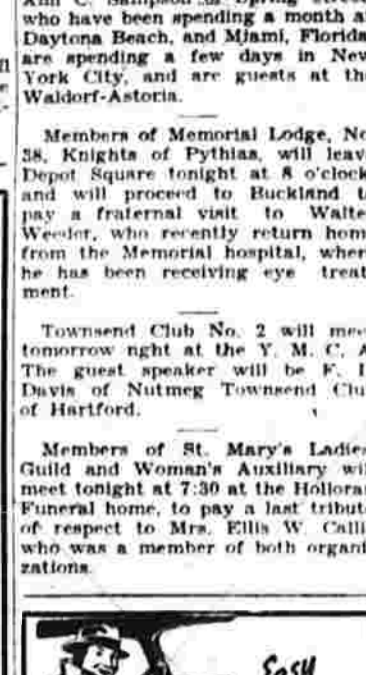

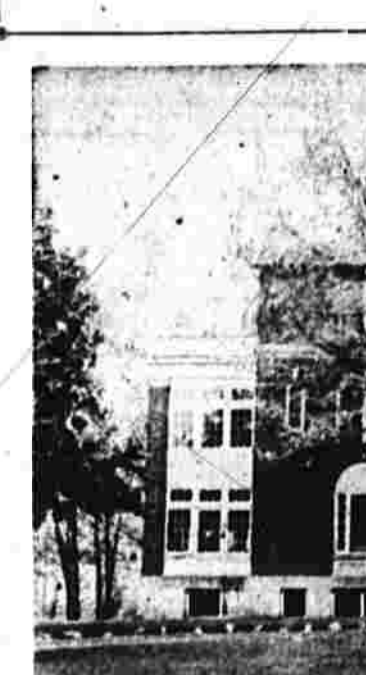

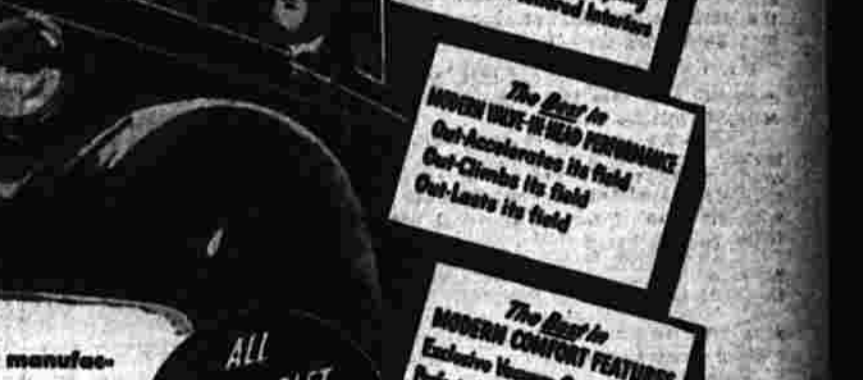

American Envoy To Attend Papal Crowning First Time

Vatican City, March 10.—(AP)—The first time a president of the United States will be represented officially at the crowning of a Pope when Pius XII on Sunday receives his triple tiara amid scenes of medieval splendor on the loggia of St. Peter's basilica.

The American ambassador to London, Joseph Kennedy, is due in Rome tomorrow as the official American representative at the ceremony which is expected to draw the largest popular crowd ever assembled in the Eternal City.

Vatican authorities expect more than 200,000 persons to jam St. Peter's piazza and open spaces before to witness the coronation. Forty thousand may sit or stand inside the vast church throughout the five-hour pontifical mass preceding the coronation.

It will be the first time in nearly 100 years that a Pope has been crowned outside St. Peter's. The late Pius XI was crowned inside the basilica but, after the Lateran accord by which Italy and the church reconciled their differences, made his first appearance on the balcony in 1929.

To Be Broadcast To World

The coronation mass and ceremony will be broadcast to the world, also for the first time.

Forty foreign missions of one kind or another are to attend.

Former King Alfonso XIII of Spain may attend.

In addition to the usual tribunes erected inside the basilica for formal sections to seat the Pope's family, the nobility, diplomats and Roman aristocracy, there will be a special stand for the foreign missions.

N. H. ABANDONED 186.6 MILES OF LINE LAST YEAR

Non-Paying Branches Dropped With ICC Sanction To Aid Finances; Total For 1937-38 Was 268.75.

During the past year, the New Haven Railroad, with permission from the Interstate Commerce Commission, abandoned exactly 186.6 miles of unprofitable branch lines.

The railroad, which was one of the largest in the country, is bringing the total length of the line relinquished in the last two years to 205 miles. The abandoned lines constitute an important part of the New Haven's general program of retrenchment designed to place the company in a position to operate successfully under current conditions.

Although the many segments of track dropped in the past two years were other profitable factors in a long time, the railroad is now fully demonstrated to the commission that it is not forced to operate unprofitable lines.

Notwithstanding that the railroad, it was asserted, had taken from the rails the larger part of the business previously handled over the lines involved.

Main Abandonments

During 1938, the principal abandonments of non-paying branch lines in Connecticut were as follows: West Haven to Orange, 4.77 miles; West Winsted to Canaan, 15.18 miles; Griffin to Hill Quarry, 4.88 miles; Griffin to Lakeville, 1.93 miles; Winsted to High Street, 2.90 miles. More than 100 miles of branch lines in Massachusetts and Connecticut were abandoned in 1938.

While the abandonment of 275.8 miles of branch lines has been necessitated by financial reasons and not by any desire on the part of the railroad to discontinue service, the New Haven is now in a position to continue to improve its main line service both with respect to passenger and freight service.

It is pointed out by company officials that the abandonment of lines is the acquisition of new modern equipment which includes more powerful steam and electric locomotives and a large fleet of streamlined, air-conditioned passenger coaches.

Freight and freight operation has been improved by the acquisition of new motor truck feeders and delivery service.

Reporting today on the first experimental test of a new motion-picture technique for training in reading developed at Harvard's Graduate School of Education, a trio of educators commented:

"Under the training, the students as a group increased their reading speed by 50 per cent, gained in reading accuracy, and altered for the better their habits of eye movement."

That they should, also, as a group, improve in scholarship, especially by a small amount, seems especially important, considering the many factors other than the ability to read which contribute to college grades.

The new technique, developed by Prof. Walter F. Dearborn, director of the Harvard Psycho-Educational Clinic, and Dr. Irving H. Anderson, instructor in education, with the cooperation of James R. Brewster, director of the Harvard Film Service, gives promise, they believe, "of being one of the most effective devices for the improvement of skills in reading."

Through the use of motion pictures, the eyes of the spectator are held in the most important places of the text. Successive phrases are flashed rapidly across and down screens in a manner which attracts the reader's eye involuntarily to each group of words as it appears. The constant use in habitual swift reading, the educators say.

Earlier, by photographs of the eyes, scientists learned that the direction of the eyes in motion picture reading was in the numbers of stops, or involuntary halts of about a quarter of a second each during which the eye takes the word of phrase into distinct focus—per line of reading was reduced from 10.5 to 5.5, Dr. Anderson said.
