

Report Desperate Battle
Dispatches from Burgos, Franco's capital, said Nationalist scouting planes flying over the Republican capital reported a desperate battle still in progress yesterday. These reports said the Communists and Miaja supporters seemed about evenly divided.

While Miaja's men apparently had cleaned out the center of the city, the Communists were said to control an almost solid ring of fortified buildings in outlying sectors. Only on the southeast, these reports indicated, was there a break in the Communist cordon—a battle line within the 28-month-old defenses raised against the Nationalist siege. It was impossible to determine what effect the internal fighting had had on Republican troop disposition in the one-fourth of continental Spain still unconquered by Franco. One unconfirmed report, however, said two full divisions—one Communist and the other loyal to Miaja—were advancing on Madrid to join the fight.




