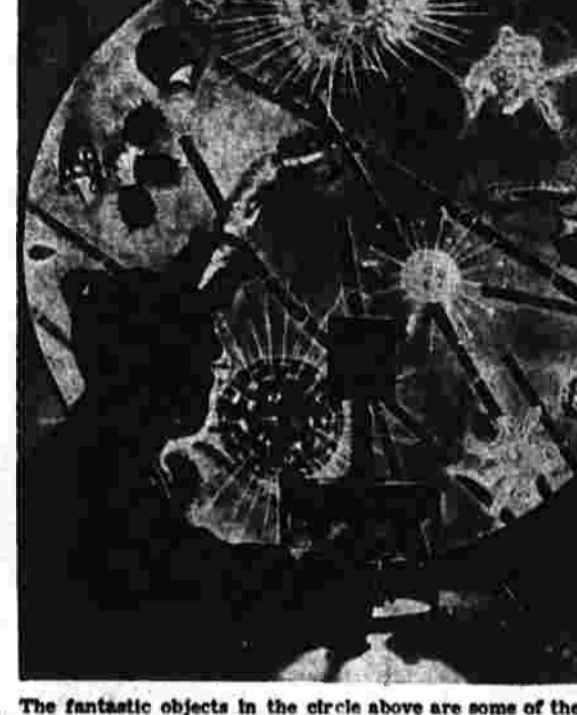

CZECH FEDERAL STATE DISSOLVED BY SLOVAK INDEPENDENCE ACTION

Republic Torn Apart By Slovak Parliament Acting Under Protection Of Hitler With Pledge Of Nazi Troops To Aid In Case Of Trouble Creating Nation.

BRATISLAVA, March 14.—(AP)—The Czechoslovak federal state was formally dissolved by its government today, five and a half months after its first dismemberment by Slovakia, with one foreign army already invading its soil and another threatening to march in.

The German government, led by Adolf Hitler, cleared its conscience by offering to give the Czechs the right to self-determination. It was announced during the World War by President Woodrow Wilson and created at the Versailles conference.

HUNGARY ACTS TO GET AREA FROM CZECHS

Sends Ultimatum Demanding Evacuation Of Troops In Carpatho-Ukraine; Fighting Occurs On Frontier.

BRATISLAVA, March 14.—(AP)—The Czechoslovak republic was torn apart today by a Slovak Parliament acting under the protection of Adolf Hitler and with a pledge of German troops to aid in case of trouble.

The parliament, which met in Bratislava, decided to dissolve the federal state and to declare the independence of Slovakia. It also demanded the evacuation of Hungarian troops from the Carpatho-Ukraine region.

NAZIS HALT MEASURES FOR SOLVING PROBLEM

Slovakia's Proclamation Of Independence And Conferences Of Haha With Hitler Halt German Action

BERLIN, March 14.—(AP)—Slovakia's proclamation of independence and a forthcoming conference between German Chancellor Hitler and the Slovak president have halted the Nazi measures for solving the Carpatho-Ukraine problem.

The German government had announced that it would support the Slovak declaration of independence, but only on the condition that the Slovaks would accept German influence in the region.

COUNCIL WORKS TO AID FLIGHT FROM MADRID

Action Taken To Remove Republicans Feared On Blacklist Before Making An "Honorable Peace"

MADRID, March 14.—(AP)—The Nationalist government is working today to facilitate flight from the Nationalist zone by Republicans.

The government has announced that it will issue a blacklist of individuals who are considered to be active in the Republican cause. This move is seen as an attempt to force Republicans to leave the country before they can be targeted.

WASHINGTON, March 14.—(AP)—Senator J. P. Cawley, one-time Republican, urged Congress today to curtail the president's monetary powers.

Cawley argued that the president's current powers over the money supply are excessive and should be limited by Congress to prevent potential abuse.
