





Fort Lauderdale, Fla., March 15.—(AP)—A fire so huge that it generated rain slowly ate into nearly 15.000 acres of muck soil in the Everglades west of fiere today. The smoke pail over the blazing area obscured the sun and delayed all traffic between Miami and the north. Acres of sawgrass, baked by the heat, caused the flames to spread rapidly.

A column of intense smoke, rising perhaps a mile high, covered the area north and west of the burning mucklands. From the smoke a slow drizzle of muddy rain fell, caused by the heat of the fire.

Generate Own Rain Ernest Carson, Miami meteorologist, said blazes of such extent and intensity are rare, but when they occur they frequently generate their own rain. The heat causes a large column of air to ascend rapidly, expanding as it rises. The expansion brings on condensation of water vapor which falls as rain, he said. Southeasterly winds were expected to keep the smoke away from Mismi and other coasfal centers to day. The white shroud that covered those cities yesterday slowed traffic, caused ten automobile collisions. 



Attorney Explains Whole Town's Interest In Water

The order to equalize the loss of the half mill in taxation, it is Bowers contention that by some method the town water department should rebate to the town treasury the tax money that the town has lost by actually the town ha

the town owned water department, which also controls sanitary sewer lines and disposal, is not one that hits at the north end taxpayer alone, but is one that affects every taxpayer in town.

Bowers' remarks were occasioned by developments Monday at a meeting of the Board of Selectmen. At that time an open informal hearing was held, after a petition had been submitted by property owners on Courtland street who asked for sewer line extensions. When it was announced that each property owner would be assessed the actual cost of materials for the work, the

coat of materials for the work, the labor being free as a WPA project. the owners balked, and voted not to go ahead with the sewer building proposal. Spokesmen argued that the installations should be totally free. This would mean that the coat of such installations would have to come out of general taxation, and such a plan is bitterly opposed by north enders who are not served by the town-owned system but by district and private systems for sewer and water. Although some sewer mains have been installed totally free to property owners, it is officially explained that the greater footage of such is cut through town owned lands, and serves to tie in whole sections rather than individual properties.

According to E. J. Holl, property owner and developer, the town has a "nerve" to ask property owners to pay for sewer installations, and then to make a continuing charge for sewage disposal. Approximately 30 per cent of each south end water bill is credited to sewage disposal.

With Holl, Bowers takes issue.
Assessments, according to Bowers, are the only equitable means of arranging payment for extensions of service, and, according to his view, with only half the town served by the town department, no funds from general taxation can be used for extensions.

But Bowers' views on the town owned system go farther than to unclude the problem of the moment in regard to service growth.

According to the attorney, the taxpayers all over town, and not alone in any one section, are being

alone in any one section, are being imposed on by the water depart-ment.

ment.

Superintendent Fred Parker of the water department has pointed out that in acquiring the department, the town assumed no actual debt. When the utilities were purchased from Cheney Brothers, they were taken over on a bond issue which a being not of disputers.

chased from Cheney Brothers, they were takn over on a bond issue which is being paid off directly from water department income, and though a bond-paying surplus is being gathered, rates still are considered very low compared with other towns. Parker's view is that the town itself is actually getting the water works for no outlay other than a guarantee to pay the bonds. With this outlook on the problem, Bowers is not paired.

He points out that, as Parker says, the system is being acquired without the outlay of purchase money by the town, but according to Bowers, the transfer of the system is not being done free to the taxpayers.

When the utilities were privately owned, Bowers says, the property of the service was assessed to a point where income in taxation on it returned about a half mill to the town treasury. When the town took over the property, this half mill tax payment was lost. Thus, the acqualities of the water company really is costing the townspeople annually a half mill, or, putting it another way, the town tax less to be a half mill higher because of the possession of the water department.






