





Up to half a century ago, the most plentiful and conspicuous of American spland game birds was the prairie chicken. Agriculture, over grazing, fire, plus good roads, automobiles and an increasing army of hunters have almost wiped out the prairie chicken A number of states have established refuge areas for these birds. There is a smaller species, found on the great plains from Kansas to Colorado, also the Attwater prairie chicken of the southwest. The eastern form, the heath ben, made its final stand at Martin's Vineyard. In 1932 the last bird died after the state of Massachusetts had spent \$70,000 in an attempt to save the species. Male prairie chickens engage in elaborate dances during the mating season. On their necks are sacs of naked skin which they inflate when they are performing.
