Niemoeller became a leader in the newly-formed, fighting Pastors' Emergency League and in the new Confessional Synod which was set up within the framswork of the official Protestant Church to work in opposition to the Nasis' "worship" of Hitler.

The Nasis accepted the challenge. Again and again they suspended Niemoeller "permanently", arrested him, tapped his telephone, made raids on his home.
