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PROPOSE TO HOLD DOWN SEA RATES

British Government Will Attempt To Handle Reinsurance on Shipping Risks.

London, April 14.—(AP)—The British government is preparing legislation designed to hold down marine insurance rates which have climbed sharply recently because of war fears.

As contemplated, the government itself would undertake to handle reinsurance on shipping risks in the interest of British trade.

The proposal was outlined yesterday in the House of Commons by the Under-Secretary of State for the Colonies, Mr. W. A. R. Wood.

Mr. Wood said that the government plan relates to ordinary cargo, including food grains and specie to and from the United States, such as underwriters have insured.

On the other hand, the revised schedule greatly increased premiums on shipments not included under the government scheme.

The old rate to the United States was 100 per cent for shipments to and from the United States.

For shipments outside the government proposal the rate will be 100 per cent for shipments to and from the United States.

For shipments to and from the Mediterranean and Baltic seas an additional premium of 25 per cent will be payable.

The old rate to the Mediterranean and Baltic seas, 100 per cent, will be reduced to 75 per cent.

The rate for specie is half the ordinary rate.

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SLAYER OF FRIEND PAYS WITH DEATH

Last Entry In One Of Illinois' Strangest Homicide Cases Is Written.

Joliet, Ill., April 14.—(AP)—The state wrote the last entry in one of its strangest homicide cases today by sentencing Edwin Wood to death in the electric chair.

Wood, 36-year-old Grundy county farmer, ended a Damon and Pythias friendship by slaying Almer Nelson, a wealthy bachelor farmer.

Wood and Nelson were lodge brothers. They had been close friends since childhood.

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Sedatives and Anesthetics Affect Baby's Respiration

Indianapolis, April 14.—(AP)—A study of 5,000 labor and childbirth cases just completed by Dr. W. C. Cole, University of Detroit pediatric professor and his associates showed the use of sedatives and anesthetics "definitely decreases" the chances of delivering a perfect baby.

Dr. Cole, who outlined the findings in a lecture before Indiana University postgraduates here last night, said the chances of delivering a perfect baby "decrease almost uniformly in relation to the amount of drugs administered."

The "greater" contribution to the individual cases, he explained, is premature birth, with the use of drugs ranking second.

The effect of drugs, he said, was seen in the cases of mothers whose deliveries were affected by their own illness, who needed the aid of sedatives or who underwent cesarean operations.
