

Denver, April 20.—(AP)—Crop-sugar beets and even vineyards are hungry grasshoppers and Mormon crickets, which robbed western tarmers of an estimated \$83,400,000 last year, plagued three far western areas today while cool weather delayed their 1939 attack elsewhere in the west.

More amply warned than in the past two years, farmers in nearly all western states have organised to wage a polson campaign against the insects along the same lines that saved an estimated \$176,000.

The first great horde of hoppers to srupt from egg pods deposited in the soil jast year moved along a 35-mile front today in the southwestern corner of California's rich San Josquin valley.


