



Amsterdam, The Netherlands, April 21—(AP)—Nazis lost heavily Wednesday in 11 provincial council elections which usually indicate the trend of national feeling. The Nazis polled only four per cent of the vote in 1937 and they lost more than a third of that yesterday. Liberals gained three percent, Christians 2.5. and Catholics one. Communists lost 0.15 and Socialists 0.6 per cent as compared with 1937.

Greenland—a Country Buried in Ice NATURE has played a savage hand with Greenland. It has cut her coasts into jagged fjords and bays, denuded her lands and covered 87 per cent of the area with ice. Greenland is thus one

of the most barren, forbidding spots in the world.

But it is also one of the most fascinating—to science. It is a gigantic problem which attracts expeditions from all parts of the world. Scientists come to study of continents.

Greenland occupies an area more than equal to France, Geresany, Spain, Foland, England and Hungary combined. It has an estimated area of 827,000 square miles and it is the largest land mass near the North Pole. Almost six-sevenths of Greenland is covered by ice, yet the remaining


The interior of Greenland is a vast fee plain at a height of about 9000 feet, infinitely desolate. So the animal life is reindeer, bear, walrus, fox, wolf, seal and muskox. Along the coast, however, there are hundreds of varieties of flowering plants. 
