## What It Means: Roosevelt's Message

Washington— There's a growing belief among the men who make world affairs a life study that President Roosevelt's peace message to Hitler and Mussolini will be remembered more for the things it left unsaid, than for the trank and positive statements it contained.

Nearly a year ago The AP Feature Service revealed for the first time a changing emphasis in American foreign policy. Without altering the fundamentals on such things as entanglements, the Roosevelt administration was slowly building up a new foreign relations picture.


