





Independent sources said one division of 20,000 men was arriving. Chinese close to Japanese Army circles said a great Chinese offensive was expected by Japanese in early May.



Where the East Begins

THE news spotlight seldom turns n the Gilbert and Ellice Islands, British protectorate in the South Seas. The last time the whole world took interest was when the sircraft carrier Lexingon and three escorting destroyer pushed as far west as these islanthe islands are drawing attention again but this time only because of the British new "reign" stamps picturing life on these Pacific dots.

These islands are so far west

that they mark where the east begins. They lie in the Pacific just across the international date line, about 1600 miles southwest of Hawaii. The total area is roughly 180 square miles and the popula-tion is about 35,000. But this 180 square miles is scattered over a million square miles of ocean. Because of their location, the this group of islands westward slong the equator. This is a drift which would carry a floating object 10 to 40 miles a day. Natives often take adventage of this drift to make long open cance voyages. There is the story of two islanders whose boat traveled 1200 miles in this relentless current.


