



Is it fish or fowl or beast? That is apt to be your first query when you see the platypus in a zoo, and it is extremely unlikely that you will see one. This small, mole-like animal is completely at home in the water, with its webbed feet, has a bill like a duck, yet it is covered with fur, laye against the covered with fur,

It digs a hole in the ground for nesting during the mating season and the female goes into a sort of suspended animation during this period. The eggs are leathery-shelled. Curiously enough, the female usually presses two or three eggs together immediately after laying them so that it is hard to separate them even by force.

As soon as the female takes to her nest, the male platypus deserts her, but the mother shows exceptional cumning in taking care of her young. For one thing she has adequate defense in a cort of spur in her back legs which ejects an irritating fluid that causes a bad wound. And so the cycle goes on.
