### BOWRON SUCCEEDS IN 'PURGING' FOUR

Los Angeles Mayor Unseats Two Incumbents in Municipal Election.

Los Angeles, May 3.—(AP)—Mayor Fletcher Bowron, former Superior court judge swept into office last fall on a "reform" ticket, succeeded today in "purging" from the city council four of its six members he designated as unacceptable to his administration.

**STEEL OFFICE WORKERS CUT TO FIVE-DAY WEEK**

Pittsburgh, May 3.—(AP)—Seven consecutive weeks of dividing operations caused "Big Steel" to return more than 10,000 of its "white collar" workers to a five-day work week with a corresponding reduction of 31 per cent in the pay. Mill workers were unaffected.

The United States Steel Corporation yesterday ordered offices closed on Saturdays at its operating subsidiaries including Carnegie-Illinois, the National Tube, American Bridge, American Steel and H. C. Frick Coke Companies whose office employees have been on a 4 1/2 day week.

The shorter work week was inaugurated in February of 1938 when the national operating rate was around 30 per cent. In this city, the extra half day was reduced to 3 1/2 days as mill operations exceeded 50 per cent. The rate now is below 48.

Lafayette, Ind., May 3.—(AP)—Ralph Metcalf, Democratic investigator who joined the German-American Bund to learn how it functioned, says there are half a million persons enrolled in the American Nazi movement.

That assurance, he said last night in accepting the Cardinal Newman award for 1938 for his distinguished services in the war on racketeering, should be credited to the "thousands of citizens"—judges, business men and workers—who "dared to stand up and fight."

An overflow audience of more than 3,000 persons witnessed the presentation of the emblem in the University of Illinois auditorium and applauded the prosecutor when he said:

"Clean Government good politics. The extermination of organized crime is gradually progressing from city to city. Its sponsors are being driven from power. The people have a right to feel that they are no longer to be victimized by the racketeering and the underworld."

In high places it has been learned that clean government can also be good politics. It will take years to finish the job but the good news of today is this—America is cleaning its own house."

Dr. John A. O'Brien, director of the Newman Foundation, described the award as the "largest and most enthusiastic" of the organization's efforts to bestow the award annually on "an individual whose public and outstanding contribution to the enrichment of American life in the fields of science, literature, art or statesmanship."

It was Dewey's first public appearance in the Midwest since he achieved fame as a prosecutor and national political figure as a Republican presidential candidate.
