THE current year brings back the story of James Madison with particular significance; 1939 marks the 150th anniversary of the setting up of the United State government and it was Madison who framed the Constitution which provided that government. No colorful figure was this dry ittle man, son of a Virginia plant-er. He led no armies in the Revo-lution, he was no public idol. Yet he carried a tremendous influence. He hated war but he served the

cause well in Congress and when the struggle was all over he served the country well again, warning it against the flood of


