
All covers for the first flight should be dispatched to the post-master at New York, N. Y., under separate cover with an accompanying letter specifically requesting the postmaster to hold same for the first flight. Failure to follow these instructions may result in covers being dispatched by regular mail prior to the first flight since the postmaster has no authority to hold covers unless instructed by the sender.


