Tokyo, May 9.—(AP)— A chemical factory and a celluloid plant exploded within 500 yards of an Army powder magazine today, and at least 11 persons died, 260 were injured and more than 30 are missing.

The celluloid factory, in the suburb of Komamezawa, blew up first. Fire spread to the chemical works which in turn exploded. Six other factories and 30 homes were destroyed by flames.

It was the third damaging explosion or fire in military areas in two months. (A powder magazine blew up in Hirakata March 1, killing nearly 200. Five Naval warehouses burned at Yokosuka March 6.)




