### STUDENT'S IMPRESSIONS OF MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

Robert Custer, Superintendent For A Day, Writes Article For The Herald Describing Observations.

Robert Custer of the Class of 1939 at Manchester High School, 1939, author of this, the first in a series of articles on the Manchester Memorial Hospital as seen through the eyes of a student, served as "superintendent" of the hospital on Monday, May 11. His impressions are first-hand gained through close observation of all that went on in the hospital on his day of duty.

Custer points out in his story many of the features of the hospital in an intimate way, many details not given to the patient or visitor of special interest was his observation of the special anatomy service in the hospital.

Other interesting features of students of the high school senior class will be printed in the Herald from time to time. Custer's article follows: "I reported at the hospital at 9:00 o'clock of Manchester's 'Youth Day' and began duties as Superintendent of the hospital. With Dr. Harry C. Smith as a helpful and cooperative co-worker, we first made a routine trip of all the departments to get a report from the 'boss' on condition of progress of the departments and to give orders for the day.

The first department covered was the operating room. The superintendent's duty is to keep up-to-date persons from participating in the actual surgery. In the doctor's room, I was robed in a white gown, after which we entered the operating room. An abdominal operation was being performed. I recall the ordeal bravely, but after four minutes everything started to get hazy and little black spots danced before my eyes. Dr. Smith grabbed me out quickly and put my hand between my knees, which is the first thought of surgeons in treatment of fainting.

When I was again able to face the world, we headed for the next department, looking about my experience. I was consoled when he told me that the majority of people who react as I did.

The next department was the accounting, which is a unique and special system. Dr. Smith told me that every item of expense is numbered. This system facilitates accounting and observing details of hospital statistics per capital cost, etc.

An inspection of the mechanical phases of the hospital was next. We inspected the boiler room and the laundry which is an efficient system in itself.

Next I went over the mail where I found an array of bills. After I cleaned up the correspondence for the day we proceeded to participate in a very enjoyable part of the program of the day—that of operating on a luncheon hospital.

Visited The Patients. We visited three ward patients. One afternoon, one boy having a plaster cast from under his arms to his toes. I was much surprised to learn that these were cases from which no compensation would be received by the hospital. The cost they would probably be there for four more months.

"I was lucky to have been there on a day when a class of nurses was graduating. As the superintendent, I interviewed a salesman and in the afternoon, we found 150 necessary to go to Hartford after other equipment for the new general ward which is being moved and enlarged at considerable cost.

"Once again, we featured the operating room, now empty and harmless looking to check over instruments. Each piece of equipment must be purchased by the superintendent and a knowledge of when, where, and how to buy it is necessary. I was interested in the highest achievement in scientific medicine.

"Other departments visited included the morgue, which is not a pleasant sight. I wish everyone could have been in my place to get the inside story on what an excellent job the hospital does on a comparatively small amount of money each year.

### URGES TACKLING BIGGER PROBLEMS

Louisville Executive Urges Laying Aside Ghost Of Peril To Press Freedom.

Columbia, Mo., May 11—(AP)—Mark Ehrbridge, general manager of the Louisville Courier-Journal, urged newspapermen last night "to lay aside the ghost of our threatened freedom and get down to more pressing problems."

### 1938 Farm Exports Climb To Highest In Eight Years

Washington, May 12—(AP)—American farm exports during 1938 were valued by the Agriculture Department today at \$528,000,000, the largest amount since 1930.

The report was given out as the Senate was winding up debate on the record-breaking \$128,000,000 Agriculture Department appropriation bill.

Actually 17 Million Less. At the final vote measured on the farm bill, Senator Russell (D-Ga.) floor leader for the measure, said that even with Senate increases of about \$88,000,000, the Department of Agriculture will actually have about \$17,000,000 less for the next year than it had this year.

"A lack of participation by farmers in the crop control program in 1937, Russell explained, had prevented a large carry-over of funds for use in 1938.

"We have more farmers cooperating this year than last and smaller carry-overs," he said. "It would be a pity to let the program slip at this time."

### RAILROAD DEATHS AT LOW FIGURE

Smallest Number Killed In 15 Years Among Employes; Injury Decreases.

Chicago, May 12—(AP)—Accidental deaths among employes of the nation's major railroads in 1938 totaled 400, the smallest number in 15 years.

The National Safety Council reported the figures today in announcing the winners of the 12th annual railroad employes national safety contest.

Winners were determined on their casualty rates—the number of fatalities and injured per 1,000,000 man-hours worked by employes during the year.

The Union Pacific railroad won first place with a casualty rate of 2.50 among its 500,000 employes. The second place was won by the Great Northern with a rate of 2.55.
