The Social Security Board reported, meanwhile, that the number of cases receiving general relief from Public funds last month declined 2 per cent in 37 states and the District of Columbia. The survey covered 115 urban areas. Casper Way reported the greatest deper, Wyo., reported the greatest de-crease—44 per cent.

Obligations incurred for general relief from public funds decreased 8 per cent during April, the board es-timated, with increases being re-ported by only 14 of 115 cities.






