New Hope in Meningitis

A new hope for persons who develop meningitis was offered by Dr. Daniel S. Cunning of New York city. Sulfanilamide combined with surgery and daily tapping of the brain fluid through the spine gives hope in cases where no hope existed before.

In the past maningitis resulting before.

In the past meningitis resulting from infections of the middle ear were almost 100 per cent fatal. However, in 15 cases treated at the Queens General hospital, New York, the mortality rate was cut to 25 per cent by radical "cleaning" of the mastoid bone, intensive use of sulfanilamide, daily drainage of the mastoid bone, intensive use of sulfanilamide, daily drainage of the spinal canal and blood transfusions when needed. None of these measures alone is sufficient to save the life of a meningitis patient, Dr. Chinning declared.




