

Of American Farming NOTHING is more epic in American history than the con quest of the west and the rise of the great plains farmer. A few

years after the Civil War the country between the Mississippi and the Rockies was unbroken wilderness, save for a few mining camps, military and trading posts. By the turn of the century this same country had become the agsame country had become the agricultural heart of America.

The great rush to the frontier began with the passage of the Homestead law in 1862, but the Civil War and the Indians held back, settlement. By 1876, however, the Indians were practically conquered for all time, so that bomesteaders moved in to plow where the ground was still hard-packed by buffalo herds. Thereafter it was only a matter of time until the lion's share of the na-tion's wheat was being produced But all this came only with bit-

grasshoppers and money panic. At the same time he battled the big cattlemen who had driven their herds into the great plains even before the farmer. The cattlemen wanted unlimited range; the farmer wanted fences. Not until farmer wanted fences. Not until 1890 did the farmer finally wim. But today, tronically enough, there is talk that in many sections the cattlemen might have done better for the west than the farmer. In any event, farming was in its heyday around 1900. 



