Linked North and South CREATEST factor in the economic recovery of Texas after the Civil War was the movement of millions of Texas cattle, in vast drives, north to Kansas reilroads and markets. Of equal importance was the bond created between North and South in the development of the great cattle industry of the West. Most of the trail herds followed the Chisholm trail, a route first narked by 11 companies of U. S. Army troops, retreating in 1861 from frontier outposts to Fort

Leavenworth, later by Jesse Chis-holm, half-Cherokee Indian trader, for whom the trail was named.
The extension of the Kansas Pacific railroad to Abilene, in 1867, provided a market for Texas onghorns, and for 20 years, huge herds, numbering from 4000 to 6000, plodded slowly northward. From all parts of Texas and as tle were driven along these
