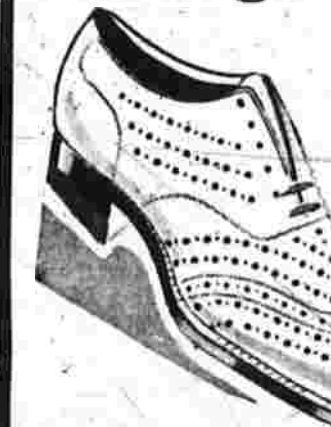

REPORT GEHRIG IS THROUGH AS A BALL PLAYER

Clinic Check-Up Reveals Yankee Slugging Star Is Suffering From Chronic Infantile Paralysis.

New York, June 21.—(AP)—Ed Barrow, president of the New York Yankees, announced today that Lou Gehrig is suffering from chronic infantile paralysis and will probably never play baseball again.

Barrow's statement came after Gehrig had turned over to him the report made by Dr. J. H. Brainerd, a specialist in infantile paralysis, who has examined Gehrig in the clinic in order to have a check-up on his physical condition.

The one-time great first baseman had been worried about his condition since after making a fall showing in the field and at bat during the early part of the season.

Gehrig voluntarily severed himself from the Yankees' roster last week.

ASSERTS ALCORN WITHHELD DATA

Crawford Says Prosecutor Neglected To Introduce Papers Of Alderman.

Waterbury, June 21.—(AP)—Defense lawyer George W. Crawford asserted today that Special Prosecutor Hugh M. Alcorn withheld data favorable to one of the accused in the Waterbury "million-dollar" fraud trial.

Crawford, representing Simon J. Alderman, New Haven accountant, charged that the state had neglected to introduce his client's working papers, which it had in its possession, as an exhibit.

The defense attorney told the court that these papers, showing in detail the record of Alderman's employment of the city during December 1937, had been surrounded by the state with a "wall of silence" and that the prosecutor had neglected to introduce them.
