Not so well known is Mendel's new story.

Gregor Mendel was born in Moravia, on the Polish-German border, in 1822. A brilliant student, he entered the Augustinian monastery at Altbrunn at 21, continued his studies of botany and natural history at the University of Vienna.

His botanical research, from 1836 to 1871, found him experimenting with controlled fertilization and cross-breeding. His work on the edibie pea, now used to illustrate his theory, occupied seven years. Mendel was named abbot, died in 1824. It was not until two decades later that his achievements were recognized.

Mendel is shown on the Danzig commemorative, red and brown, above. The inscription translates: "Healthy Children—Joyous Future."
