



Bill to Increase Vets' Home Aid

Washington, July 19.—(P)— The Senate has approved and sent to the White House, a bill which would double the Federal contribution for maintenance of state homes for disabled soldiers and sailors.

Senator Walsh (D-Mass), Senate sponsor of the measure, estimated the measure would increase by \$122,640 the government's contributions to New England homes.

Under the proposed law contributions would amount to \$240 a year for each disabled soldier or sailor, a \$120 increase.







Built in 1889 as the central atceeded in height only by the Empire State building (1248 feet) and the Chrysler building (1040-feet). It weighs 15,400,000 pounds, is composed of 12,000 steel plates held together by 2,500,000 rivets. Approximately 17,000,000 persons have "climbed" the tower.
Elevators now carry visitors to landings on each of the three platlandings on each of the three platforms, but in the early years of
