



The "Soo"-World's **Busiest Ship Canal**

ONE vessel every 18 minutes is the record average maintained at the five locks of the "Soo"— the ship canal at Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., connecting Lakes Superior and Huron.

Although the waterway is open only eight months of the year, the

annual tonnage transited is great-er than that of the Panama and er than that of the Panama and Suez canals combined. Most recent figures available for a 12-month period record the "Soo" total of 87,633,699 tons; Panama, 29,298,766, and Suez, 32,776,000.

The first canal and lock around the rapids of the St. Marys riverwere built on the Canadian side in 1798. The lock was 39 feet long, eight feet wide with a lift. long, eight feet wide, with a lift of nine feet. The lock was de-stroyed by United States troops during the War of 1812. Proposals for the construction of an American canal were drafted as early as 1837 but dissension, delays and failures prevented the until 1853. The State canal, conlisting of two locks, each 350 feet long and 70 feet wide, was opened in 1855. These locks were destroyed in 1888 and replaced by
