

The most heartening moment during his captivity was when he was given a note from his father, delivered to the roving band by a Bedouin intermediary.

"Father also enclosed three letters from my wife which gave me renewed energy," Goldner anid.

"But always when I thought of my predicament I tried to put my wife out of my mind because it caused me untold misery knowing that ahe was worrying about my fate.

"I want to get out of here as soon as possible and return to my wife and child in the United States."

The police confined most of their questions to getting descriptions of the kidnapers. Goldner asid he had pledged himself, before his release, not to disclose the identities of his abductors nor their whereabouts.

His arrest followed several warnings by the state labor department. His pleaded guilty, was fined 550 and costs and ordered to take back all mislabeled goods sold in the state including his mattresses now offered for sale in various stores in the state.

Judge Fred Trotta of the New Haven City Court who fined Rudsick told the defendant that he would not be parmitted to sell any more goods in this state, until he completed the job of removing all of his mislabeled mattresses.



Regulation 122 of the State Sani-tary Code states that no public fair grounds shall be used except after Ogden, Utah, July 26—(P)— Imfull and literal compliance with the prisoned five days in a box-car withfull and literal compliance with the following regulations:

As To Water Supply
Any water supply available for drinking or washing dishes on the fair grounds shall be of safe and sanitary quality.

Any water found unsafe for human consumption on such grounds shall be either eliminated or purified by a process approved by the state department of health or shall be posted with placards definitely warning people against its use.

Fiv-tight privies or waterflushed

Fly-tight privies or waterflushed tollets with a system of sewage disposal approved by the state department of health shall be provided and shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition. Separate installation for men and women shall be provided and they shall be adequate for the accommodation of all persons attending or using the fair grounds. The location of all tollets shall be plainly indicated by signs.




