

Two Governmental Bodies Extend Hand to Business

Washington, Aug. 10 — (F)— A was regarded as something of a recongressional committee and the new Federal Works Agency held out a hand to business today, one asking advice on taxes and the other offering data to help the building industry meet vast governmental needs.

The House Tax Committee, laying the groundwork for a broad study on the Federal revenue structure, invited businessmen to submit written suggestions for tax revision.

At the same time, John M. Carmody, Federal works administrator, disclosed plans for conferences with builders and makers of building materials. He will furnish detailed estimates on the agency's future requirements so that steel, cement, lumber and similar industries can the Experts Work Out Program.

Imber and similar industries can plan ahead.

To Prepare Estimates of Work Carmody said he had directed the bureaus in his agency to prepare estimates on their prospective work, broken down by materials, months and states.

"I can't think of any greater service to business men," he said, "than to tell them in advance how much will be spent by the government in each industry throughout the year."

As a result, he speculated, an industry might find that its production rate was insufficient to meet the government's needs and fill other orders.

"Some of them may find," he added, "that they will have to go to the banks and borrow money. There's a lot of it there ready to be borrowed."







Vibrations Check Theory On Structure of Earth

formis institute of Technology, told the Geological Society of America how a comparison of earth wave recordings of two widely separated stations cinched the conclusion.

Geologists and earthquake experts long have taken it for granted that the earth is made up of a series of spherical layers, one outside the other, from the core to the surface. But they never could prove it below certain shallow levels because man never has been able to bore very deeply—three miles or so, at most.

The supposition was that earthquake waves moved faster and faster as they progressed into the earth's depths because of the constantly increasing pressure due to the weight of the secumulated layers. This weight compressed the subterranean matter so tightly that it responded with increasing ease to the vibrations.

But seismologists discovered that

Waves Blow Down

But seismologists discovered that at a depth of around 50 miles the waves mysteriously slowed down.

Gutenberg and Richter found a yay to check up on the mystery—by comparing the waves of earthquakes originating at various depths. Their seismograph at Pasadens and that of the Carnegis Institution of Washington at Huancayo, Feru were used—the latter because it is near an area that produces a great many quakes, some of them 400 miles down.






