

The quarrel was believed to be so serious, however, that the cabinet might fall—and 'twas rumored that the lives of the premier and other statesmen had been threatened. ### Remove Prostate Gland Of Centenarian Negro

Chicago—(F) —Removal of the tion gave that advice in an article prostate gland of a 110-year-old Negro—believed by medical authorities to have been the first operation of its kind on a centenarian—has been reported in the Journal of the American Medical Association.

The report was made by Dr. J. Bayard Clark of New York who said the patient "demanded a square meal" on the morning after the operation, and that on the third day he was "propped up in bed joyfully puffing away at an ancient pipe." Within six weeks and five days the hospital. A year after the operation—performed to correct a benign enlargement of the prostate and a mild chronic inflammation of that gland—the patient was alive and apparently in very good health.

Commenting on the report, Dr. Morris Fishbein, editor of the Journal said that age was so frequently a bar to operations that the fact a successful one had been performed on a man of such extraordinary age was "unusual." He added that only 30 persons out of 3,000,000 live to be 100—much less be able to survive an operation.

Dr. Clark reported that the patient claimed he was born in slavery in 1827 in Virginia and that careful inquiries tended to substantiate the story of his age. His name was not given.




