**Building Shows** On Mysterious Blight Gain in Month

Kingston, R. I., Aug. 18—(P)
—Rhode Island State College scientists worked at top speed in their laboratories today in an effort to isolate a mysterious blight disease found to be ravaging the state's entire \$100,000 peach crop.

Known to baffled scientists only as "X," the strange virus blight first attacks the common choke cherry and then spreads to the peach trees, destroying the nearly-mature fruit, harvest of which has just begun.

The blight, which the scientists said apparently entered Rhode Island from nearby Connecticut and Massachusetts orchards, was noted for the first time yesterday at Foster and Greenville.

Dr. Everett P. Christopher, professor of horticulture, urged destruction of choke cherry bushes to prevent spread of the disease before completion of the harvest, estimated at 40,000 bushels this year. 5 Millions.




