



TOROBABILITY of attack, President Roosevelt told Congress last January, "is mightily decreased by the assurance of an ever ready defense." Congress consequently upped appropriations for defense, and now America's big air, land and sea rearmament program is well under

The air corps already has or-dered 2,500 new planes and engines and has begun training 2,100 more pilots and 19,000 mechanics and other specialists. The army is ready to let big contracts for tanks and other weapons and is recruiting men faster than scheduled. The navy has 101 warships and auxil-

fary vessels under construction or under contract.

Work on four new Pacific island bases was ordered started last week: preliminaries have been completed for bases in the Caribbean area and elsewhere. Soon, steps will be taken to build a third set of locks (which may take six years) for the 25-year-old Panama Canal, and its garrison will be nearly doubled.

Invasion Imagined
This week more than 70,000 men shouldered arms and pretended America was being invaded.
The first "battle," lasting four days, was fought near Manassas, Va. A streamlined, mobile, regular army division of 5,800 officers and men, supported by 70 tanks, was assigned to advance on Washington, D. C.; and about 18,000 national guardsmen organized along conventional lines and equipped with only eight tanks was ordered to halt this advance.

Simultaneously, the biggest military movement in American history took place: 52,000 men assembled around Plattsburg, N. Y., where another big battle, to last three days and be judged by 350 umpires, is to be fought this coming week. 




