her husband are the only married among the eight women members Mrs. Smith is the only mother. With Parachute Firm Mrs. Smith's husband, J. Floyd Smith, is vice president and chief engineer of the newly formed Pio-

neer Parachute Company with offi-ces and plant in the Cheney Milla. An exciting life this pair has lived from the day early in 1911 when in circus acrobatics and decided to build a plane. Floyd Smith knew nothing about planes, nor could he fly one, never having taken a les-son. But in a few months he had his plane built and taught him-self to fly. He practiced flying in a field two blocks wide and three blocks long for five days and ther carried Mrs. Smith as his first passenger. He had to make two and three circles of the field before he the field told them they would have to pay \$5.00 a day rent so the next morning they flew to a small air-port at Griffith Park, Los Angeles,




