PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT begged Reichsfuehrer Hitler last April to lay down his arms and let world problems be solved peacefully. In an address to the Reichstag then, Herr Hitler vowed: "No German shall ever enter a conference defenses."

Relations between America and Germany already were bad. They have not improved. The SEC recently refused to approve a German bond issue because of the Reich's secrecy about its budget. Germany is the only world power not represented at the New York fair this summer. For nine months, U. S. Ambassador Hugh A. Wilson has not been in Berlin and German Ambassador Hans Dieckhoff has not been in Washington.

Mr. Roosevelt, nevertheless, sent peace pleas early in this summer's crisis to Italy's king, Poland's president and Germany's dictator, and urged the settlement of the Polish-German dispute by direct negotiations, administration of the League of Nations and the League of Nations. Poland promptly replied favorably to Mr. Roosevelt's plea.

At Home

Olson's Way Out
When Upton Sinclair advocated "production for use" during his 1934 campaign for California's governorship, conservatives said he was a Communist. This week California's new Democratic Gov. Ship Searching

In New York, U. S. officials searched for the submarine, which the Bremen's owners had ordered it to track back to Germany and their spokesman called the executive examination "unfair."

Mr. Roosevelt explained that the search was made to determine whether the ship was equipped for offensive war purposes.

Europe Pits Pens Against Swords

A 72 a. m., Aug. 26, an order to German troops facing Poland was canceled. The same trustworthy spokesman who revealed this to AP's Berlin bureau said German generals had advised Reichsfuehrer Adolf Hitler to grant Europe another reprieve from war.

The Tannenberg celebration of Germany's victory over Russia 25 years ago that day—at which many Nazis had expected Herr Hitler to announce a bloodless victory over the Poles—had been called off. Japan: Abort Focal
Japanese generals blocking the British consulate in Tientsin slipped the faces of German, rather than the Russian, news of the Russo-German aggression last reached them. In Tokyo, the Rome-Berlin-Tokyo pact against Communism was discussed and Premier Kiichiro Hiranuma and his cabinet agreed. At a meeting of the cabinet, Gen. Nobuyuki Abe, 64, a retired army leader, then formed a new cabinet with himself as premier and an ex-ambassador as foreign minister.

Gen. Abe was said to favor more bowing to the U. S. and Britain, but he announced he would "deal firmly with all nations that fail to cooperate with Japan. Americans, meanwhile, were clearing out of Tientsin, not because of diplomatic developments, but because of the disease and stench of floods, which were estimated to have done \$100,000,000 damage.

Gen. Abe also was said to have once favored a Russo-Japanese non-aggression pact, but this week there was talk of a Russo-Japanese war. Nippon rushed reinforcements into Manchukuo and strove to wipe out once and for all the Soviet forces which have been defeated in the Far East.
