In the first proclamation issued under acts of 1909 and 1917, the president said that, "whereas a state of war unhappily exists between Germany and France; Poland; and the United Kingdom, India, Australia and New Zealand; on Terms of Friendship

"And whereas the United States is on terms of friendship and amity with the contending powers, and with the persons inhabiting their several dominions;
"And whereas it is the duty of a

"And whereas it is the duty of a neutral government not to permit or suffer the making of its territory or territorial waters subservent to the purposes of war;
"Now, therefore, I. Franklin D. Roosevelt, president of the United States of America, in order to preserve the neutrality of the United States and of its citizens and of persons within its territory and jurisdiction, and to enforce its laws and treaties, and in order that all and treaties, and in order that all persons, being warned of the general tenor of the laws and treaties of the United States in this behalf. of the United States in this behalf, and of the law of nations, may thus be prevented from any violation of the same, do hereby declare and proclaim that by certain provisions of the act approved on the fourth day of March, A. He issued an executive order giving specific instructions to the various government departments to carry out the various provisions.

The chief executive declared that during the life of this proclamation no warship of a belligerent should be permitted to use an American port for any warlike purpose or to obtain warlike equipment; no privateer of a belligerent should be permitted to depart from any American port; no warship should be permitted to leave an American port until after the expiration of at least 24 hours after the departure of an opposing warship.

The president proclaimed that no warship should be permitted to remain in an American port or waters more than 24 hours except in case of bad weather or for delay in receiving supplies or repairs, or when detained by the United States.

The president declared that all the provisions of the proclamation shall also apply to the Canal Zone except into far as they may be modified by a special Canal Zone proclamation.
