The war in Europe appeared today to have brought President Roosevelt nearer a reconciliation with some Senate critics of his policies than at any time since many of them rebelled against his proposal to reorganize the Supreme court in 1937.

At the same time an administration supporter, Chairman Bloom (D., N. Y.) of the House Foreign Affairs Committee, told reporters that the conflict had already assured House passage of the president's proposal to repeal the embargo against arms shipments to warring nations.

Democrats who voted against outright repeal at the last session of right repeal at the last session of Congress showed more than enough had changed their minds to change the verdict at the special session beginning next Thursday.

Although there were signs of improving relations between Mr. Roosevelt and some critics, there was speculation as to whether relations between him and Senator Borah (R. Idaho) would suffer from the latter's leadership of those opposing repeal. posing repeal.

Critizes President's Program

Borah criticized the president's program to revise the neutrality act in a radio address last night, say-

in a radio address last night, saying:

"When we couple repeal with the announced and declared program of furnishing arms and munitions to one side and withholding them from the other, such a program will undoubtedly, constitute intervention in the present conflict in Europe."

Mr. Roosevelt is obviously eager to unify as much of Congress as possible behind his program. Recently he has made friendly gestures to three powerful Democratic senators who have at times opposed his policies—Harrison of Mississippi, Glass of Virginia and George of Georgia. The latter was one of those who voted with a majority of the Foreign Relations Committee last July to postpone action on neutrality legislation.

While there has been no public reaction from George, both Harrison and Glass indicated a willingness to let bygones be bygones.

(Discoverer of Radium Was Too Poor to Buy It

WHEN Pierre and Marie Curie WHEN Pierre and Marie Curie discovered radium, in 1898, the world hailed their schievement. They were awarded the Nobel prize and Pierre Curie was given a professorship at the University of Paris, a poet to which his widow was elected after his death in 1908. After the World War, however, Mme, Curie saw her research nearing an end because she could not afford to buy the radium necessary for her experiments.

The cost was prohibitive—\$100,000 a gram. Had the Curies patented their discovery, she would have had ample funds, but

the use of radium, belonged to the world.

The women of America heard of Mme. Curie's need. Thousands of contributions poured in. When the famed French scientist arrived in United States in 1921, President Harding presented her with a gram of radium, a lasting gift made possible by those contributions. In 1929 another gift of \$50,000 was made to her.
