



Debussy's 'Reverie' Won Fame 20 Years Late W/HEN Claude Debussy, famous WHEN Claude Debussy, samous plano composition, "Reverie," he had little thought that it would ever become a dance "hit." But an American swing bandmaster "discovered" the melody, wrote lyrics and made it one of America's most popular modern tunes. Almost overnight, America became Debussy conscious. many other compositions have
been favorites for years.

Debussy's life is divided into
two distinct periods. The first was
that of a Bohemian, struggling for

that of a Bonemian, strugging for existence, starving. During this period he married Lilo Texier and with her won acclaim.

His divorce from Lilo and his second marriage, to the wealthy mother of one of his pupils, marked the beginning of his second period. Surrounded by comforts, living in a magnificent hotel, he enjoyed luxury with a quiet egotism that contrasted with his perpetual restlessness.

Debussy died March 25, 1918.
