It was chiefly against Russia that the hatred of Joseph Pilsudski, one of the organizers of the Legion, was directed. An ardent patriot, Bilsudski had been exiled and imprisoned for his anti-Russian activities. During the Russo-Japanese war he offered the services of the Legion to Japan, but


