



Imperial Russia annexed Bessarabia in 1812, but under terms of the Crimean war peace treaty of 1856 Bessarabia was returned to Rumania. There was another Russian annexation of the area after the Russo-Turkish war (1877-78), and Russia held it until 1917.

With the Russian revolution, Bessarabia, Poland, Finland, Lithuania and Estonia declared their independence of Moscow, and the Bessarabian National Assembly voted in April, 1918, to unite with Russian.



(Dobruja and Bessarabia form Rumania's Black sea coast, while Transylvania is land-bound.)

Hungary was understood to be willing to waive her claim to Transylvania, provided she obtained a guarantee of her present territorial integrity. As compensation for Rumanian-Bulgarian frontier rectification, Rumania was said to have requested Russia to recognize Rumanian sovereignty over Bessarabia.

Russia's interest in the proposed neutrality pact lay in her desire to insure the Balkans and eastern Mediterranean against German dominance. Such a pact, it was said, also would protect Italy in her southeastern European interests.

A survey of authorities and observers of the Balkan stuation showed a clear-cut divergence of opinion as to southeastern Europe's future, especially Rumania's if negotiations for a Balkan security system fall.

Imperial Russia annexed Bessarabia in 1812, but under terms of the Crimean war peace treaty of 1856 Bessarabia was returned to Rumania. There was another Russian annexation of the area after the Russo-Turkish war (1877-75), and Russia held it until 1917.

With the Russian revolution, Bessarabia, Poland, Finland, Lithuania and Estonia declared their independence of Moscow, and the Bessarabian National Assembly voted in April, 1918, to unite with Rumania.

Germany has developed a system of fortifications which differs essentially from the French Maginot line in its depth.

The defenses go back as far as 35 miles from the frontier and consist of a mase of criss-crossed concrete and steel obstructions, pill boxes or bunkers camouflaged into the land-scape and fortress-like battlements invisible to the eye.

Roughly speaking, the west wall is a system of four lines of defense. The first two are for infantry and artillery. The third and fourth are for anti-aircraft defenses. The first line is so thickly studded with concrete blocks and bunkers that in an area a half miles long we counted 70 pill boxes, each connected underground with the others.

Each of these bunkers is so arwith the others.

Firing Criss-Crosses

Each of these bunkers is so arranged that firing from one crisscrosses the fire from another. Hence,
even if one were silenced, others
spitting their fire simultaneously
might prevent the enemy from entering the breach.

Germans believe they have improved on the Maginot line by

with each unit capable of functioning independently, yet communicating with the others for synchronized
action.





Early Saar stamps were German values overprinted with the French word "Sarre." These were replaced by three regular sets. In addition, Germany printed two propaganda stamps for the 1935 plebiscite and four commemora-tives upon the return of the Saar to the Reich.
