Almost every succeeding day increases the toll of unprotected merchant ships. Arrangements for convoys are underway and liners cross the Atlantic in blackout. War experts believe German U-boats were on the way to appointed rendezvous long before the actual declaration of war. The submarine was Germany's best World War weapon. Almost useless in naval battles, the underwater craft preyed upon com-merce, inflicting terrific damage. In the four years of war, German submarines sank 5408 vessels, totaling 11,189,000 gross tons. In April of 1917 the undersea raid-

vessels at the rate of one every Germany's war-time high in U-boat strength was 140 subma-rines. In 1914, Germany had 28 subs, but in four years completed more than 300 more. She lost 200 by sinking and surrendered 138 to the Allies.


