War Won't Hit Building Here

Ferocious Increase in Activity During Europe's Strife, Says Article

Chicago, Sept. 29.—"What will we do to build? How fast will we rise? and, is a home good buy now?" are three timely questions answered in an editorial survey in the October American Builder magazine.

"One powerful argument that builders and realtors can use to effective advantage today is that in a world full of uncertainty and confusion the average citizen will find, more than ever before, that a home is one of the best and safest forms of investment. No matter what happens, Mr. John Citizen has to have a place to live, and in a home of his own he is more secure against rising costs than in a rented house or an apartment where rents have already risen sharply up. With the possibility of inflation ahead the home owner with a long-term mortgage stands to profit. He can now obtain a 20 or 25-year mortgage with a fixed monthly charge that is the lowest in the nation's history. The purchase of a home on such terms is the best possible hedge against inflation that the average citizen can make."

"This time we are in a rising building market with a definite shortage of homes. The stock market has sprung upwards at once—and a rising stock market has always been an aid to home construction. The American banking system today is strong. Business in general is better prepared for war—psychologically and otherwise. The anticipated war demand for American goods will come at a time when business income is moving upward. The result should be a sharp upturn in business of all kinds—not just in war materials. It is a natural conclusion, therefore, that better business, more wages, higher values and higher market values will have a favorable effect on home building.

"Roy Wenzick, president of Real Estate Analysts, Inc., speaking before the National Association of Woodwork Jobbers in Chicago a few days ago, said, 'If you are going to build a home, now is the time to do it.' November and December show slow growth in construction gains, he declared, and predicted that the first six months of 1940 will be good. After that, rapidly advancing building costs will affect the rising volume, he insisted.

"There has been much loose talk about rising building costs. If the war continues there will eventually be a considerable rise. Opinion differs as to the extent of rise possible. Wenzick points out that building costs advanced 216 per

Women's Stand On Neutrality

Favors Putting All War Trade Under the Cash And Carry Plan.

Why the people of Connecticut should urge their senators and representatives in Congress to vote to amend the neutrality act, so as to include the change recommended by Secretary of State Hull and Senator Key Pittman, chairman of the Senate foreign relations committee, were explained by Miss Katharine Ludington of Old Lyme, president of the Connecticut League of Women Voters, at a meeting of the board of the "Armington League of Women Voters."

"America is a neutral," Miss Ludington said. "An enormous minority of people in this country want to stay out of the war; the difference of opinion comes on the question of how to stay out."

"It is a legal neutrality which in practical effect favors Germany, a safer way to stay uninvolved than an equally legal neutrality which favors the Allies." Is it safer to sell war materials and carry them in our own ships, or to put all war trade under "cash and carry"? The League of Women Voters favors putting all war trade under cash and carry as the best way to keep out of war."

Japanese Fall Back As Chinese Strike

Shanghai, Sept. 29.—Chinese reports said today Japanese troops

driving toward Changsha, capital of Hunan province, had fallen back before a counter-offensive by thousands of fresh Chinese fighters. The Japanese continued to report advances within 20 miles of the city. (At Hongkong, Chinese sources denied earlier Japanese reports that Changsha was in flames and her defenders fleeing. They told of advances that the city was quiet and her defenders were "steadily resisting Japanese attacks.")

One of the major features of the Convocation is the series of functional seminars scheduled for the afternoon of Oct. 12.

A seminar on Preaching will be held by Dr. Tittle. One on the Church's Ministry through Missions in the Modern World will take the form of a public conversation with the following participants: Dean Malcolm Pitt, Kennedy School of Missions at the Hartford Seminary Foundation; Miss Edith E. Lowry, Executive Secretary for the Council of Women for Home Missions, New York; and Rev. William H. Lester, of the Connecticut Church Committee on China Relief.

Dollar a Day For New Home

Monthly Payment Averages \$30.06 Director Of FHA Reveals.

Through the modern home financing facilities of the Federal Housing Administration, it is now possible for a dollar a day, according to an announcement made yesterday by John F. Gaffey, State Director of the FHA in Connecticut.

The records of the Federal Housing Administration reveal that during the year of 1928, families in the United States built or bought 97,618 new homes of their own through the FHA plan. The average monthly payment on these new homes is \$30.06 a month—or slightly less than a DOLLAR A DAY.

Big Chicago

Said Mr. Gaffey, "A dollar a day for your home—that certainly is a modern arrangement in home financing, and a far cry from the days of the first and second mortgages system which caused much misery, it seems almost an impossibility that homes can be built on such liberal terms as a DOLLAR A DAY, but our Washington office has actual cases showing that these payments are approximately one dollar a day or less."


"More than that," continued Mr. Gaffey, "FHA officials know that approximately 60 per cent of these families who built or bought homes through the FHA plan last year are making even smaller monthly payments for their homes. The payments include such charges as principal, interest, and mortgage insurance premium. Of course, taxes and fire insurance must be included in these monthly payments which are conveniently arranged."

"These liberal financial opportunities which the FHA have offered to the public throughout the Nation have not been designed particularly for the family of 'means.' It has been our observation that the moderate income-earning family in the income range of \$2,000 to \$2,500 has been the greatest contributor to the modern housing market."

One Every Three Minutes

It is also estimated that ground is broken for one of these homes every three minutes of every weekday and an average of 500 homes have been selected for appraisal by FHA every working day in a week. The FHA plan is not designed for a "chosen few." It is designed to place home ownership within easy reach of the average wage earner.

"Looking toward home ownership as the heart's desire of most folks—the FHA insured single mortgage plan serves a long-felt need in the matter of home financing, and offers to many a chance for that dream to come true. Besides that, the home buyers and lenders, FHA's insistence on sound construction standards and neighborhood requirements assure, as far as possible, that the homes offered as security for insured mortgages are durably built, in communities of established values, and under general conditions
