The speed displayed by the local tax enumerators on Monday, the first day for taking the census, indicates that the work may be finished in less than a week. It is estimated that there will be about 4.5000 names enrolled subject to the old age assistance tax of \$3 due next February.

On the first day the enumerators turned in 1,200 names. This was possible because they started in the most central and most congested part of the town. From now on the workers will not have so early a task and to finish the remainder of the work will mean that often they will be unable to turn in 50 names for a day's work, which will also include call backs at night.

Recruit Boys for Guard.

Finnish boys of 14 and 15 were being recruited in a voluntary Civic Guard, which is carrying on large scale emergency preparations in cooperation with regular army reserves.

While no official estimates on the strength of Finland's military reserves were available, observers estimated the nation could put 600,000 men in the field.

The best sources placed the present regular army strength (active and reserve) at about 300,000. (The standing army has about 30,000 men.)

The navy it was said, had been preparing for a possible crisis since last spring, and no new emergency preparations were expected. The navy consists of two 3,900-ton coast defense vessels, five submarines, six gunboats, 21 minesweepers, six mine lavers and 19 patrol boats.

The barbers associations of the state have become rather weak of late and when the last Legislature met the holiday dates were changed.


