### Little Balkan Nations Favor No Belligerent

#### Striking Instance of Independence Seen in Failure of Germans to Get War Materials.

Oct. 18.—The little nations of southeastern Europe are maintaining their independence spirit by refusing to favor any belligerent country economically, a survey indicated today.

A striking instance of this independence was seen in failure of a German trade mission to obtain any great increase in vital-needed war materials from the section which she considers one of her natural trade areas.

Experts from Berlin spent more than a month in the capitals of Rumania, Yugoslavia, Bulgaria, Greece, and Poland, and it was no secret that they also hoped to close this area as much as possible to Great Britain and France by purchasing the bulk of all the supplies the little nations could export.

To get no more goods.

The net result of the mission's strenuous negotiations is that Germany is to get no more goods, regardless of her needs, than she is to get in peace.

The things turned out in the little nations:

Yugoslavia—A new agreement leaves the old trade agreements unchanged but provides that Germany must greatly increase her shipments to settle large clearing-house deficits or run the risk of losing Yugoslav contracts. Statistics just issued show that Yugoslav exports to Germany dropped from \$25,000,000 in the first eight months of 1938 to \$19,000,000 in a similar period this year.

Bulgaria—The prices Germany must pay for all goods are raised by a new agreement which provides payments largely in oil and the rest in gold.

Oil Export Unchanged.

Rumania—The export of oil, the greatest need of Germany's mechanized army, is left unchanged by the new trade pact. Restrictions on the agreement, stipulations on oil-producing areas of Rumania indicate a decline in shipments to Germany because of difficulties of shipping for transportation to Hungary. Because of her new common frontier with Germany, Hungary was counted on a ship the Reich vast quantities of fats, which are scarce in many parts of Germany. But when the German experts come to Budapest, the question of payments was raised, for Germany already owes Hungary \$15,000,000 in German marks. The Hungarians' attitude is to be that trade increases were no good if the result was a paper one.

Turkey—Several trade agreements expired. Turkey served notice she would not negotiate a new one.

Germany's trade in the Balkans is handicapped by transportation problems in addition to the points mentioned.

### Ask No Change In Neutrality

#### Knights of Pythias Pass Resolution to That Effect at Convention.

Washington, Oct. 18.—The grand lodge of the Knights of Pythias of Connecticut in its closing session yesterday afternoon drafted an appeal to Connecticut Senators and Representatives urging them to use their efforts to resist the present neutrality act and to do everything possible to keep the United States out of the European war.

The resolution specifically demanded the continuance of the present neutrality act which is now the subject of Senatorial discussion in Congress.

George H.
