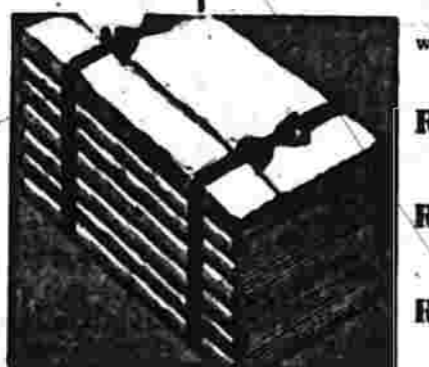

### Senate's Leaders Considering Move On Limiting Talks

**Restriction Probably Will Be Put to Test Monday When Balloting on Neutrality Bill Amendments Begins; Assurance Vote in Week.**  
Washington, Oct. 21.—(AP)—The Senate leadership considered today a move to limit debate and thus assure a vote on the neutrality revision bill late next week. The restriction probably will be put to a test Monday after the three-week-old general floor debate ends and balloting on amendments begins. Unanimous consent is required to invoke a limitation. Senators Clark (D., Mo.) and Nye (R., N.D.) oppose the administration's proposal to repeal the arms embargo, have opposed such a move in the past but the whole opposition group intended to confer during the day to decide what attitude it would take if a curtailment motion were made. Senator McNary of Oregon, the Republican leader, indicated he would not object to a moderate limitation, as did some other Republican opponents of embargo repeal. Senator Barkley of Kentucky, the Democratic leader, said he "would rather get by without a debate limitation" but that "we might be able to work out an agreement."

### Pay-Hour Law Changes Seen Biggest Need

**Hastening of Industry Committee Work Will Aid as Much as Real Enforcement of Act.**  
Washington, Oct. 21.—(AP)—After nearly a year's experience with the complicated mechanism of the wage-hour law, some officials said today that it needed streamlining as much as strict enforcement to make it more effective for workers in anticipation of the new act. They pointed particularly to those provisions of the act which authorize establishment of industry committees to fix the minimum wage floor as rapidly as possible. The 40-cent-a-hour rule now enforced by Congress for general industry was approved in 1938. The wage-hour statute, providing a general minimum wage advancing gradually from 25 cents to 40 cents an hour, will be a year old Tuesday. In only two cases, textiles and hosiery, has the industry committee system already been set up. Charges of discrimination.
