portant part in the ultimate out-come of that conflict. Fifty years of service in the U. S. Navy de-manded a loyalty that could not be surrendered when Tennessee, the state of his birth, seceded from

1810 at the age of 9. The young midshipman got his first taste of battle in 1814 when his ship, the Essex, engaged the British ships Phoebe and Cherub. In 1841, as The opening of the Civil War found him offering his services to the Union. In 1862 he led a flotilla past Confederate batteries

fiotilla past Confederate batteries at New Orleans and destroyed an enemy fleet. A year later he controlled the Mississippi from Vicksburg to Port Hudson and aided materially in the capture of those strongholds. He delivered a final blow to the Confederate cause in 1864 by destroying the southern fleet in the battle of Mobile Bay. Congress named him vice ad-miral in 1864 and two years later he was appointed admiral, the first to hold this rank in the U. S. Navy. Farragut is shown on the U. S.
