Japanese Beetle Pest Spreading in State

The Japanese beetle is present in and in Bridgeport many lawns 80 of Connecticut's 169 towns and may infest other without official record, according to J. Peter Johnson, in charge of beetle control at the Experiment Station at New Haven. Damage in lawns in Connecticut in urban areas but already in shade trees and fruit trees. Continued increase and spread may be expected in the next few years, but Connecticut may benefit by the experiences and experiments in New Jersey and other states. The Japanese beetle was first found in New Jersey in 1916 and increased to outbreak proportions by 1922. Not only lawns but shrubs, trees and the fruit crop suffered heavily from feeding by adult beetles. Early apples and peaches were particularly affected. The pest for population was reached there seemed to be a gradual decline in the sections where infestations first occurred. At about the same time a nematode parasite of the grub was found working against the beetle, and a bacterial parasite, producing the so-called "disease in the grub," was discovered. Laboratory experiments have been carried out to increase these natural enemies so that large numbers might be released as a check on beetle population in the field.
