Town's Treasury Hits the Jackpot

Turned over to the town treasury as a result of the seizure of 13 slot machines here two weeks ago is the sum of \$108 representing one-half the amount of money found in the machines when they were smashed on order of the town court. A total of \$216 was recovered, half of which goes to the town, and half to the state.

The slot machines were taken from four local clubs in a drive conducted under orders of the State Police Commissioner who ordered similar action in other towns.

Some of the money the machines contained was among the smallest of the hard luck items the owner of the machines faced. A court fine was imposed, and the value of the machines themselves is said to run to over \$1,000.

Farming Problem Still Is Unolved

Peoria, Ill., Nov. 15.—(AP)—Louis J. Taber, master of the National Grange, told the organization's 73rd annual convention today that "we have not yet solved our farm problem, and it remains with us as one of the great unanswered steps toward recovery."

Proof that the farmer is not receiving his share of the national income is evidenced by the fact, Taber said in his prepared keynote address that in the last decade farmers received barely 10 per cent of the national income, including government benefit payments.
