Says Job in Garage Tops the Presidency

General Cheney Asserts Man Can Be Lot Happier Than in the White House; Kiwanis Guest

Applicants for the presidency of the United States were advised to get a job in a garage and to be happy there, General Stewart A. Cheney in a talk before the Kiwanis Club at its bi-weekly meeting at the Country Club today. Mr. Cheney, who served as junior aide to the late Theodore Roosevelt and senior aide to the late Calvin Coolidge when they occupied the White House, spoke on the subject, "What It Takes to Be a President."

Toughest Job
Mr. Cheney's first hand observations of the task of guiding the United States have convinced him that the presidency is one of the toughest jobs in existence. A man must be intelligent about local, wide knowledge of history and government, requires moral and physical courage and must have the hide of a rhinoceros, he said. Theodore Roosevelt was the best set to those specifications in the opinion of the speaker. Mr. Cheney was high in his praise of the administration of "Teddy," especially for his successful efforts in opening the Panama Canal into being. Roosevelt, he said, was the only man who had the ability to size up people and to obtain the best results from them which science was always sound and he never lost his nerve.

Best Collide
Mr. Cheney said that William Howard Taft was a "great" conservative president. Coolidge was financially sound and Hoover was the hardest worker but his term in the White House was marred by the fact that he lost Congress and could not get along with Congress. He worked several humorous stories about the "great" president. He said that the man who drew gales of laughter. He also told stories about the "great" man of the past and present. Mr. Cheney was introduced by Herbert Hoover, who said that the achievements of his father, the Honorable John A. Roosevelt, of Manchester's outstanding leader.

Describes Simple Test For "Athlete's Heart"

Memphis, Tenn., Nov. 20.—(AP)—Next season's football players may be made to undergo a new type of examination to determine whether they will develop "athlete's heart" from violent physical exercise.

Dr. Dan G. Stine of the University of Missouri, Columbia, Mo., described today before a preliminary session of the Southern Medical Association's annual meeting a simple test which measures the ability of an individual's heart to compensate for the severe strain of athletic activity.

About ten per cent of a group of 400 athletes examined were found to have developed chronic enlargement of the heart as shown in the X-ray picture. The test is a simple one, requiring only a few minutes of vigorous young men to exercise up to the limit of their endurance.

The test consists of placing a stethoscope with a long rubber tube on the chest. Then the person alternately inhales and exhales to his lungs an exercise which wears out the test subject in about 10 to 15 minutes.

The heart of a normal person beats about 75 times per minute. The heart of a trained athlete's heart beats about 100 to 120 times per minute when he is exhausted.

Dr. Stine declared that he believed the test to be one which is easily done and gives accurate information regarding the ability of the heart to cope with work.
