

Clue To Insanity A few years ago doctors learned how - but not why - they sometimes could shock an insane person back into his with by giving him a drug called metrazol, or overdoses of insulin. Now they have a possible explanation of that treatment which is also their first ciue to the physical nature of in-

sanity, Dr. Carl Caskey Speidel, of

the University of Virginia, told the American Pihlosophical Society bout it at Philadelphia. When Dr. Speidel gave metrazol tadpoles, whose tails are so ransparent that the nerves are visible, the raveled nerve endings were destroyed during convulsions and come similar to those produced in human beings during the shock treatment for insanity. But the dosage with metrazol was topped in time, the tadpoles grew new nerve endings which arranged themselves in a new — and often less confused-alignment of nerve






