### Town Needs New Charter, Not Patchwork Changes

By E. Malcolm Stannard

In the course of the public discussion of the plan by which certain interests wish to establish a new town charter in Manchester, it has been claimed by some that Town Treasurer George H. Waldron's estimate that such a system would double the election costs to the taxpayers is too high — that other places of comparable population succeed in having the new system without additional expense.

Such assertions do not stand up for proof. The voters of Manchester will go to the polls to decide whether or not the town will embark on a program of haphazard changes in the town's governmental structure. It is not until the voters have decided that they will accept a new charter that the town will be able to determine the actual cost of such a program.

Specifically, the voters tomorrow will either approve or reject a plan whereby four voting districts would take the place of the present single district. This plan is being presented by the town's governing body as a means of saving money, and it is claimed that it is not more expensive than the present system.

Not at all. Counting the costs of registration, old age assistance tax, and other expenses of conducting an election, Manchester's election costs are considerably heavier than in other towns. The cost of a new charter is not more expensive than the present system, and it is not more expensive than the cost of conducting an election in other towns.
