### The Old Sawyer Says:— I Have Often Been Asked

"What will happen, if in building a home I use lumber that has not been dried to the proper moisture con-tent under controlled conditions which pre-shrink the lumber uniformly?

"The answer is: Anything may happen.

"You have, let us say, planned a beautiful arched opening between living room and dining room. Green, raw lumber is used in framing that arch, and is then covered with lath and plaster. As it dries out, the lumber twists or bows; irresistibly it pulls at the lath and the lath pulls at the plaster. The beautiful arch develops 'crows' feet' — cracks will run from it in all directions, depending on whether one or more pieces of green lumber are exerting their pull back of the arch. Warping lumber pulls at roofing nails and tears the roofing and you have leaks; window framing of green lumber will cause windows to stick or to rattle; green floor joists will become distorted and floors will buckle or sag and squeak; doors will either stick, or won't stay closed; dust will find entrance around loose window casings, drafts sufficient to cause curtains and hangings to billow will be noticeable, and it will cost more to heat that home. These things far outweigh the small saving due to the purchase of green lumber."



STORIES IN STAMPS

Pocahontas-Smith Legend Gained Glamor With Age thrilling rescue from death by the Indian princess Pocahontas is familiar to every schoolboy. But the doughty captain kept it a se-cret for 17 years. When he returned to Jamestown

in 1607, after his capture by Pow-hatan's tribe, Smith made no mendefiance of her father's order for Smith's execution. Instead, Smith wrote that Powhatan had treated

When Smith visited Pocahontas, then the wife of John Rolfe, during her brief residence in England, she failed to recognize him and had no recollection of having saved his life. It was not until 1624, seven years after Pocahontas' death, that the full story of the rescue was told with all its planearous details. The number of guides had increased to a dozen by that time.

Captain Smith is shown on the U.S. 1-cent stamp above, issued in 1907 to commemorate the tercemtennial of the founding of Japanspape, Pocahontas and Powhatan are shown in oval frames at the upper corners of the stamp.
